- Established by Sustainable Society Foundation in the Netherlands, second Index 2008
- Finland No. 4 after Sweden, Switzerland and Norway with average 6,93 on a scale 0-10. Thailand's average score 5,0. Lowest scores UAE, Oman, Saudi-Arabia, Qatar and Turkmenistan (4,10)




