Comments and Suggestions to be responded by the Secretariat

- Mr.Kiatchai / Bangchak recommended the Secretariat to annually document financial supports provided by member organizations for TBCSD's activities in addition to their membership fees in order that the secretariat could report on these supports to meeting at the end of each budgetary year. He further suggested that the meeting is to take note of the report and formally express appreciation for the member organizations for their supports.

5. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

5.1 Public Private Partnership for Sustainable Plastic & Waste Management

(Thailand PPP Plastic)

Motion: To report progress on projects/activities implementation during the period of June to December in 2018

Resolved: Motion carried and reports acknowledged.

Mr. Paradorn/FTI presented the details of Thailand PPP Plastic “Program Background”:

- Press Conference and MOU Signing : June 5, 2018
 - Unprecedented collaboration between Thai Government, private sectors and NGOs to solve plastic waste issue.
 - 15 organizations from the government sector, private sector, and non-profit organizations signing this MOU to address Thailand plastic marine debris on June 5, 2018.
 - Thai Government announced the national goal to ‘reduce Thailand plastic ocean waste at least 50% by 2027’.

- Program Strategy and Governance

- Thailand PPP Plastic's Strategy:

“Reduce landfilled plastic waste and leakage to ocean by engaging all stakeholders to embrace and implement Circular Economy which starts from people behavior change through education, improve waste segregation and management system, and provide value added channel for all plastic waste to be reused or recycled efficiently.”

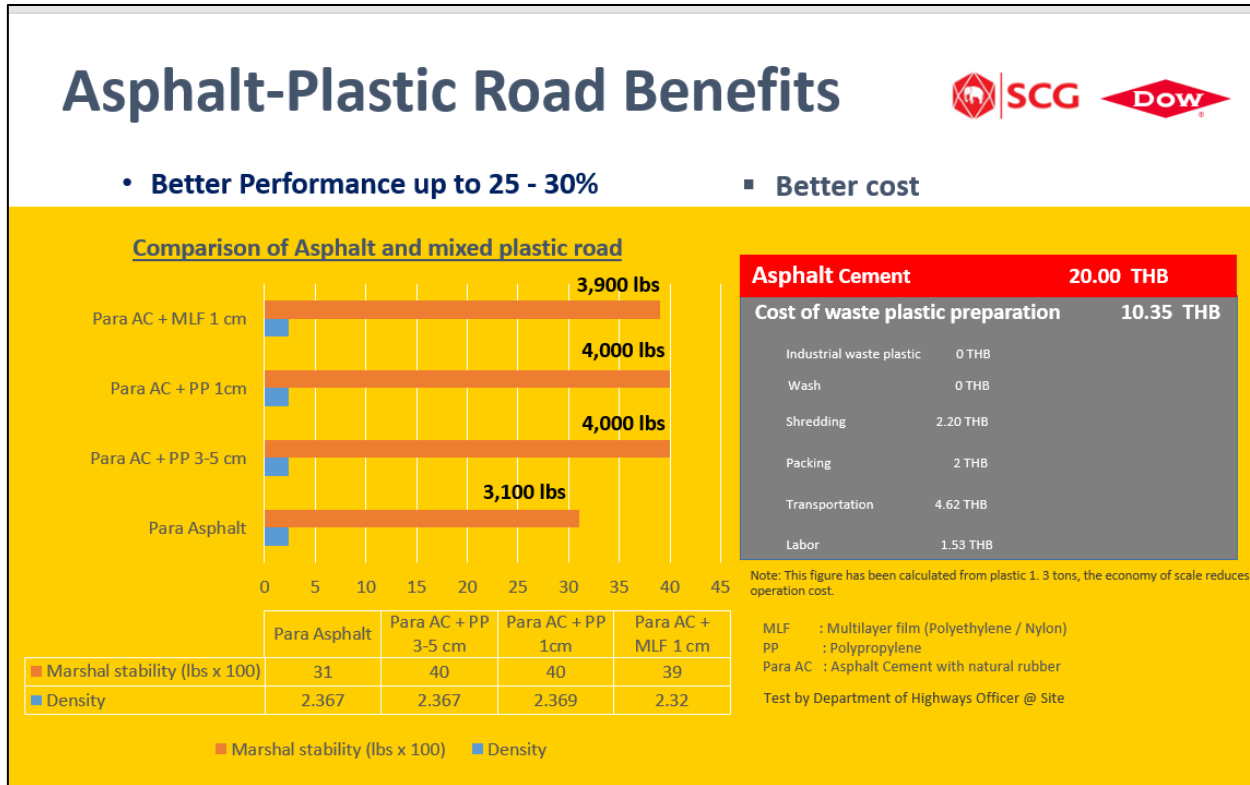
On 7 Aug 2018, the PPP Plastic led by the Federation of Thai Industry, Plastic Club Industry and TBCSD was formally appointed to be the 3rd Working Group of Plastic Waste Management Sub-Committee by the Deputy Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of National Resources and Environmental.



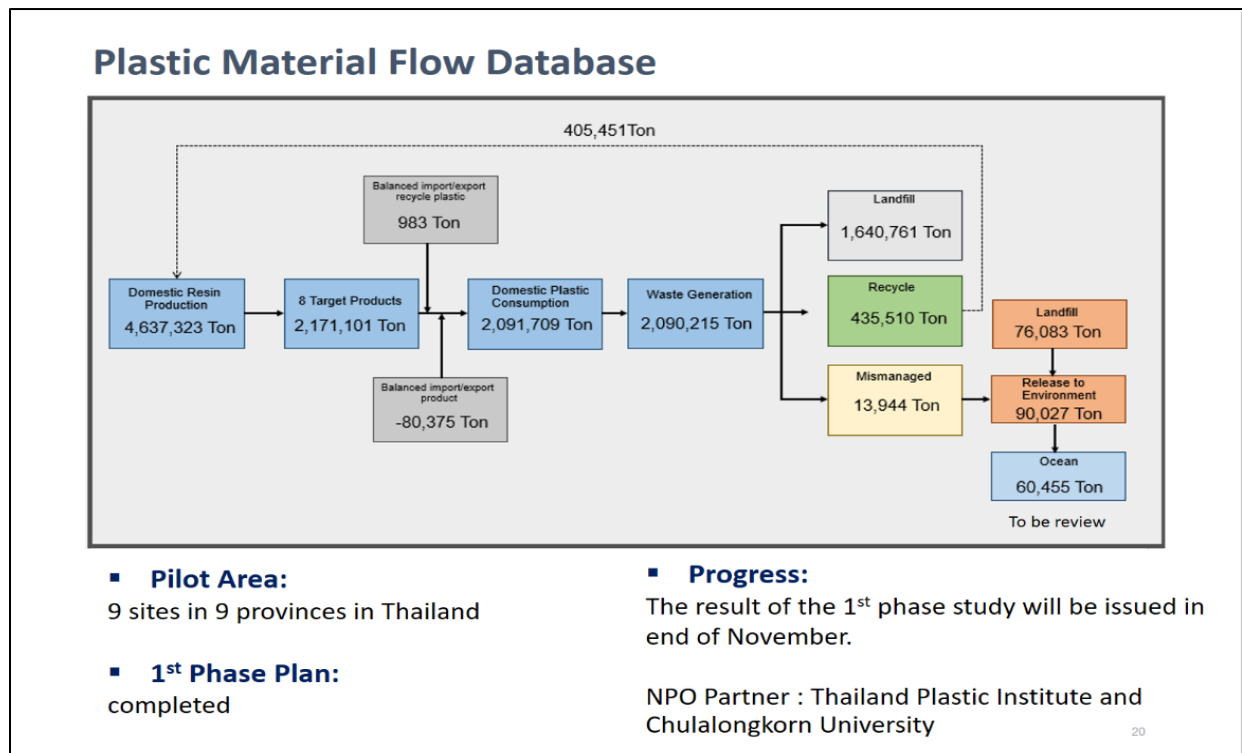
- 2018 Action Plan & Progress

Comments and Suggestions to be responded by the Secretariat

- Mr. Prasert Bunsumpun / Chairman said that the significant importance of waste disposal as well as practical problems in undertaking relevant actions, including obstructions from influential individuals and enterprises who could suffer loss from improved waste management. He noted that waste disposal had become a global challenge and believed that waste management could be more effective in the coming future.
- Mr. Pramote / Advisor said that waste disposal should be identified as a national agenda so that collective efforts might be mobilized to enable successful solution for the problem. He pointed out monitoring and evaluation as the essential components in ensuring the success of the PPP Plastic project in becoming a model for waste disposal. To this end, He urged TBCSD members with capacity to mobilize the implementation of the project to take actions that contribute to realization of the project's objectives.
- Mr. Prapon / Advisor said that recommended conducting a legal study on budget for and sharing benefits derived from local waste management, including on revision of taxation laws to enable more flexibility for waste management operators to conduct their business.
- Mr. Kiatchai / Bangchak said that waste disposal had been elevated as a national agenda with enthusiasm for participation by almost every party. He identified the lack of local actions as the major obstruction to waste disposal activities and the need to enable local awareness on benefits of the PPP Plastic project as the main challenge for achieving the project's objectives. Mr. Kiatchai recommended that waste disposal should be identified as an environmental topic for TBCSD's actions in 2019.

5.2 Road Map for TBCSD

Motion: To present the road map of TBCSD.

Resolved: Motion carried and message acknowledged. The meeting agreed that the road map of TBCSD should be proceeded as proposed.

Mr. Cholathorn / TEI said that twenty-five years after the inception of the TBCSD would warrant a redirection of TBCSD's actions for the coming future. He pointed out that TEI, as the secretariat of the TBCSD, had reviewed strengths and weaknesses of TBCSD and taken proactive steps to identify which of the strengths to be communicated to the general publics. further noted that such actions could facilitate the meeting's discussion on ideas for revision and enhancement of TBCSD's operation.

Mr. Cholathorn reiterated that TBCSD derived from the global initiative on WBCSD. He noted that WBCSD was comprised of over 200 leading global businesses and created to enable integration of business with various aspects of sustainable development. Such directive, he insisted, allowed the WBCSD to be accepted by many countries worldwide.

Mr. Cholathorn considered TBCSD as a regional network of WBCSD and a platform for implementation of numerous projects and activities of relevance. He however noted that a thorough review of these activities would found them to be insignificant in mobilizing the country's business sector toward sustainable development, ineffective in providing concrete outputs and incapable of exerting impacts to the society at large. He pointed out that members of TBCSD were leading business enterprises of the almost entire spectrum of the country's business sector and that each was capable of mobilizing sustainable development actions on its own. He believed that having such capable business operators under the common umbrella of TBCSD should collectively enable concrete social and environmental actions with impacts on the society at large.

Problems and limitations

1. Forums organized for the Council's members to discuss the TBCSD's policies might not adequately accommodate actions to resolve various issues or address management incompatibility.
2. Policies were not substantively adopted by the member organizations.
3. TBCSD structure did not facilitate taking progressive steps.
4. The lack of commitment in mobilization of projects.

Turning points

1. Executives with clear roles
 - Executives of member organizations emphasize and take explicit roles as leaders of efforts to change the society and create business organizations toward achieving sustainability.
2. Commitment based actions by member organizations
 - Environmental actions of each member organization including efforts in cooperative projects have concrete outcomes and yield benefits to the society.
3. TBCSD's structure and good governance
 - Structure and provisions for operation are transparent, reviewable, consensually accepted and developed with full participation.

Comments and Suggestions to be responded by the Secretariat

- Mr Pramote / Advisor suggested that operational revision of TBCSD should begin with redefining clear and outcome-oriented objectives, targets and missions in order to guide development of policies and strategies as well as guidance and action plans for each of the strategies. He further recommended undertaking monitoring and evaluation of the action plans with the view to determine achievement of targets, identify problems and obstructions, and generate information for holistic review of TBCSD's implementation, including possible restructuring of TBCSD. He noted that the current works of the secretariat was predominantly operational and that taking on an important task of the revision should be supervised and assisted by a vice-chairperson. He further added that the revision should be led by an intuitive and innovative individual and implemented by a taskforce comprised with TBCSD members. To this end, he nominated Mr. Cholathorn Dumrongsak from TEI to lead the taskforce, suggested development of a handbook/manual for the revision and recommended adding the topic of Road Map for TBCSD in the agenda of the next meeting in order to follow up on the implementation.
- Mr. Kiatchai / Bangchak said that pointed out that no domestic organization had explicit agenda on actions related to the environment and achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and that realigning TBCSD's targets, including indices and goals of the TBCSD's member organizations, toward achieving the SDGs would likely made TBCSD's works more internationally recognizable. He recommended taking account of projects and case studies from other countries in developing operational guidance for activities in order to assure involved parties on possibility of undertaking the activities and suggested taking efforts to enable exchange of knowledge, experience and best practices with these countries. Though this action, he believed that TBCSD could become the national leader on SDGs and gain additions to the current membership of 37 organizations providing that cooperation is made with public sector and notable associations of relevance. He further recommended the meeting to take note of the PPP Plastic project as an example for TBCSD's actions for 2019, particularly in preventing redundancy and ensuring relevancy with national agenda.
- Mr. Prasert Bunsumpun / Chairman said that the frequent change of TEI representation in the TBCSD in the recent years and the disconnection derived from the alteration of personnel. To prevent any possible adverse effects of this occurrence, He directly appointed Mr. Cholathorn Dumrongsak to lead the taskforce for operational revision of TBCSD and assigned Mr. Kiatchai Maitriwong from Bangchak Corporation Public Company Limited to participate as a member of the taskforce. He further instructed the secretariat to select an additional 5 members for the taskforce, taking into account views and opinions from the meeting as guidance for the action. He further instructed the secretariat to meet with CEOs of selected member organizations who might represent all major industries in order to seek out advices for implementation of TBCSD. He also recommended that once the selection process is completed, his successor to TBCSD chairman should have an audition with Mr. Anand Panyarachun in

order to present his/her formal introduction and ask for his advice on implementation of TBCSD.

- Mr. Cholathorn / TEI said that the budget 2019 by the secretariat for review and approval by the meeting and suggested that adjustment could be made to the budget components once revision of TBCSD's operation is finalized.

5.4 The recruitment for TBCSD chairman

Motion: To report the result of the committee in recruiting a new chairman of TBCSD.

Resolved: Motion carried and message acknowledged. The meeting agreed that the recruitment process should be proceeded as proposed and Mr. Prasert Bunsumpun will remain the chairman of TBCSD until the committee can recruit a suitable TBCSD chairman candidate.

Mr Pramote/Advisor, stated that according to 1/2018 Joint Meeting of Council and Associates of Thailand Business Council for Sustainable Development (TBCSD) on March 13, 2018. The meeting has established the recruiting committee to conduct the recruitment process of suitable candidates for TBCSD chairman. The recruiting committee consists of:

After the appointment of recruiting committee, there were 3 meetings of the committee held on April 25, 2018, June 19, 2018 and May 03, 2018 to consider the qualifications of the candidates for the position of TBCSD chairman. Currently, it was not possible to nominate suitable candidates for consideration by this meeting. The goal is to officially announce the new TBCSD's chairman at the annual seminar. Mr. Prasert Bunsumpun has kindly accepted to preside over the chairmanship of TBCSD until the committee has recruited the right person to serve as a new president.

Comments and Suggestions to be responded by the Secretariat

- Mr Pramote / Advisor reported that 7 qualified candidates from 7 organizations had been contacted for possible nomination as the chairperson of TBCSD and that none of the candidate accepted the nomination. He noted that the 8th candidate was being identified and that the selection committee might need to be reconvened to revise the selection criteria if no chairperson is found.

6. Chairman's Concluding Remarks

Chairman expressed his appreciation to TBCSD members for their support and participation in the projects and activities in this year. The next meeting will be held in February 2019 at Thai Oil Public Company Limited, Bangkok.
